## Thinking Within the Text

Evidence that the reader is gaining the literal meaning of the text

- ✓ Who is telling the story?
- ✓ What is the setting of the story?
- ✓ Who are the characters?
- ✓ What was the problem in the story? What did \_\_\_\_\_ do to solve the problem?
- ✓ What happened in the story? How did the story end? Can you retell this story using key details?
- ✓ What is this story mostly about?

### **FICTION**

## Thinking About the Text

Evidence of thinking critically about literary elements, text structure/features, & author's purpose/craft

- ✓ Why are you reading this piece? (For entertainment? To get information?)
- ✓ Is this a piece of literature or an informational text?
- ✓ What genre did the writer use? What makes you think that?
- ✓ Is this a good title for this story? Why? Why not? Can you think of another title?
- ✓ What lesson did learn? How do vou know this?
- ✓ What was the author trying to teach you? What was the message/lesson/moral of the story?
- ✓ How did the author develop the characters/plot/setting/etc.?
- ✓ Do you like/dislike or admire the character(s)? Why?
- ✓ Why do you think the author said
- ✓ What did the writer mean by ?
- ✓ How did the writer make this book interesting? Did he/she use any voice techniques?
- ✓ Look at the way the author ended the book. Do you think this is a good ending? Why? Why not?
- ✓ What was the most important part of the story? Why?

### Thinking Beyond the Text

Reader is thinking beyond the text by predicting, connecting, inferring & synthesizing

- ✓ Did anything in this story remind you of an experience that you or someone you know has had?
- ✓ Tell me some ways \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_ are alike/different.
- ✓ Tell me how felt when \_\_\_\_\_. Why?
- ✓ How do you think \_\_\_\_\_ felt when (or about) \_\_\_\_\_? What made you think that?

Reader is thinking beyond the text by predicting, connecting, inferring & synthesizing

- ✓ After reading this, what questions do you still have?
- ✓ How does this new information make you feel? What does the information make you think about this subject (opinion)?
- ✓ Do you have schema or background knowledge about this topic? Does this remind you of anything else you know?
- ✓ How has your thinking changed?
- ✓ Based on the information in the text, what would happen if...?
- ✓ What can you infer about...? What evidence in the text supports your thinking?
